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


## ABOUT COMPANY

#### **DAY 2: YEREVAN-EJMIATSIN**

- Visit the museum of the Armenian cognac factory. An excursion is planned to the place where the legendary ARARAT cognacs are born. Guests will acquaint themselves with the history and traditions of creating Armenian cognac. There will be a special reception and tasting of the best-aged cognacs.
- Temple of Zvartnots: sightseeing of the ruins of Zvartnots. Zvartnots Cathedral is a unique architectural structure in Armenia, destroyed 300 years after its construction. You will have the opportunity to stroll through the enchanting surroundings of the temple. Next to the temple, there is also a museum showcasing the history of this magnificent structure
- The Cathedral of Holy Ejmiatsin is a monastic complex, as well as the spiritual and administrative center of the Armenian Apostolic Church, the seat of the throne of the Supreme Patriarch and the Catholicos of All Armenians.
- · Back to Yerevan
- Retro evening: Back to Soviet Armenia. Here, you can immerse yourself in the atmosphere of Soviet Armenia with its way of life, customs, and history, all presented in one place. You will visit a special museum and see objects and exhibits that tell the story of the country's Soviet past. The visit also includes a themed dinner to enhance your experience.

# DAY 3: TOURS IN THE MOUNTAINS OF ARMENIA

- **Wings of Tatev:** Ropeway Tour. The Tatev ropeway, located in the Tatev monastery complex, is listed in the Guinness Book of Records as the longest in the world (5752 m). Along this cable car you will find yourself in a beautiful place that was once one of the centers of Armenian culture and education
- Tatev monastery complex. Built in the 4th century, the Tatev monastery complex was able to withstand the Tatar-Mongol conqueror Lenktemur's raids and become one of the impressive monastic monuments of the Syunik land.
- · Back to Yerevan.



# DAY 4: SCIENCE AND HISTORY TOUR

- Metsamor Historical and Archaeological Museum-Reserve. The old place dates back to the Bronze Age. The oldest gold object discovered on the territory of Armenia was found in the ancient settlement of Metsamor and is exhibited in the local museum. Here, at this ancient site, you will see altars of many gods and strange places of worship.
- Byurakan Astrophysical Observatory: close to the stars. In 2015, the Byurakan Astrophysical Observatory (BAO) was appointed by the International Astronomical Union (IAU) as a host of the South West and Central Asia Regional Office. Being one of the 11 regional offices of Astronomy, it coordinates astronomy for development activities in the nearby countries. You will be guided into the fascinating world of astronomy, where you'll have the chance to observe large telescopes and gaze at the stars.
- Amberd fortress on the slopes of Mount Aragats. Built on the slope of Mount Aragats in the 10th-13th centuries, the Amberd fortress was an important military defensive base of the Armenian kingdom of Bagratunyats and had the advantage of inaccessibility. Walk inside the fort walls and enjoy the magnificent views



### DAY 5: YEREVAN-GARNI-GEGHARD-SEVAN

- The pagan Temple of Garni. It is a unique pre-Christian structure an immovable monument of Armenian history and culture. "Here, you will not only be able to appreciate the temple built in the Greco-Roman style but also enjoy the magnificent view from the river gorge.
- Master class on baking lavash (Armenian bread). In Armenia, the process of baking Armenian bread lavash is very interesting. You will see how Armenian women prepare the dough and place it in a tandoor oven, and the result is delicious bread that you can taste right on the spot.
- Monastery of St. Geghard, partly carved into a nearby mountain. Geghard Monastery is a medieval monastery complex in Armenia. The monastery complex of Geghard is a part of UNESCO World Heritage and one of the historical attractions of Armenia. It is impressive how a portion of this monastery complex is integrated into the rock.
- **Sevan:** There is no sea in Armenia, but there is Lake Sevan, which is the second-highest freshwater lake in the world after Lake Titicaca in South America. The charm of the peninsula of the blue-eyed Sevan is complemented by one of the architectural gems of medieval Armenia, Sevanavank. Here you will be treated to delicious seafood dishes from the freshwater lake.

#### DAY 6: TBILISI - MTSKHETA

- The historical center of Tbilisi.
- **Sameba** (church of the Holy Trinity), Metekhi (church of the 12th century), Narikala fortress, cable car and sulfur baths area, clock tower near the R. Gabriadze theater
- The ancient capital of Georgia-Mtskheta. The monuments of this small town are included in the UNESCO World Heritage List.
- Svetitskhoveli Cathedral (XI century) is an ancient religious center of Orthodox Georgia.
- **Jvari** is a tiny picturesque monastery on a high rock at the confluence of the Kura and Aragvi.
- Georgian cuisine and khinkali.

### DAY 7: TBILISI – DAVID GAREJI – SIGHNAGHI

- David Gareji Monastery Cave Comple in the Gareji semi-desert.
- Village of Badiauri, where bread is baked in clay ovens "tone."
- **Convent of Bodbe**, built in the 4th century, in honor of the Assumption of the Baptist of Georgia, St. Equal-to-the-Apostles Nino.
- **Sighnaghi** is a city of love on several hills surrounded by a well-preserved double fortress wall of the 17th century.
- Tasting of Kakhetian wine.
- Back to Tbilisi

#### DAY 8: TBILISI - KAZBEGI

- **Ananuri** a fortress of the 17th century, located 900m above sea level, and belongs to the early feudal era.
- Ski resort Gudauri, beautiful landscape and flora of the alpine zone
- Church of the Holy Trinity in Gergeti, located at the foot of Kazbek and which houses the miraculous icon of the Smolensk Mother of God.
