10:00 Gyumri the second-largest city in Armenia.

10:30 Breakfast in Gyumri.

11:45 Gyumri museum of national architecture and urban life. As part of the excursion, you will visit the Museum of National Architecture and Urban Life of Gyumri. In the museum, you will immerse yourself in the life and customs of the city of Gyumri, and immerse yourself in the traditional Armenian interior.

12:30 Black Fortress from Russo-Turkish War. Black Fortress during the Russian-Turkish War. If you are familiar with the history of the bloody Russian-Turkish wars, then in Gyumri we will show you their lifeless witnesses.

02:00 Gastro Tour: Circassian valley. Gastrotour in the Circassian Valley. Here you can catch fish with your own hands, and experienced chefs will prepare it according to Armenian recipes.

04:00 Walking tour in the Old Gyumri. Tea time ,sweets of Gyumri.

DAY 3

10:00 Departure

11:00 Greco-Roman colonnaded building in Armenia-temple of Garni. The pagan Temple of Garni, once a place of sun worship, is located in the village of Garni, Kotayk region, on the right bank of Azat River. It is a unique pre-Christian structure - an immovable monument of Armenian history and culture. "Here, you will not only be able to appreciate the temple built in the Greco-Roman style but also enjoy the magnificent view from the river gorge.

DAY 3

12:20 Lavash (Armenian bread) baking master class. In Armenia, the process of baking Armenian bread – lavash – is very interesting. You will see how Armenian women prepare the dough and place it in a tandoor oven, and the result is delicious bread that you can taste right on the spot.

02:50 St. Geghard Monastery, partially carved out of the adjacent mountain Geghard Monastery is a medieval monastery complex in Armenia. It is located on the right bank of the Azat River in the Kotayk region. The famous spear with which the Roman soldier pierced the body of Christ is kept here. It was brought to Armenia by the Apostle Thaddeus, one of the first preachers of Christianity. The monastery complex of Geghard is a part of UNESCO World Heritage and one of historical attractions of Armenia. It is impressive how a portion of this monastery complex is integrated into the rock.

07:30 Dinner in Yerevan

09:00 Walking tour in the center of Yerevan. You will see the central square, the Opera House, the famous Yerevan Cascade and feel the warm atmosphere of Yerevan evenings.

DAY 4

12:00 Armenian Brandy factory. An excursion is planned to the place where the legendary ARARAT cognacs are born. Guests will acquaint themselves with the history and traditions of creating Armenian cognac. There will be a special reception and tasting of the best-aged cognacs.

02:00 Gastrotour. Embark on a gastronomic tour where you will engage in a delightful and fulfilling ceremony of preparing traditional Armenian dishes alongside a master chef.

04:00 Carpet museum. Armenian handmade carpets are known worldwide for their distinctive style and ornamentation, serving as a treasure trove of Armenia's folk art and culture. During your visit, you will become acquainted with Armenian carpets, learn about the intricacies of their creation, and witness firsthand how Armenian women craft these works of art.

05:00 Echmiatsin Cathedral is the main religious building of the Echmiatsin Catholicosate of the Armenian Apostolic Church. The church was built at the beginning of the 4th century after the adoption of Christianity as the state religion in 301-303 in the location of an already existing pagan temple, which symbolized the transition from paganism to Christianity. Etchmiatsin Cathedral is the first official church in the world. It is inscribed into the UNESCO's World Heritage List.

DAY 5

10:00 Departure

12:00 Dilijan is a city in the northern Tavush region of Armenia. Dilijan is an important tourist center. In the center of the community is Sharambeyan Street, which is considered the city's historical center, famous for its unique architecture, workshops, galleries, and museums. Dilijan is also noted as a center for hiking, mountain biking, and resort recreation.

01:30 Monastic complex Haghartsin. There are plenty of ecological routes in Dilijan National Park, accompanied by historical and cultural monuments. One of these monuments is the Haghartsin Monastery Complex, which is located 18 km from Dilijan, rising on a hill surrounded by dense forests.

02:00 Gata (Armenian Cake) baking master class in Haghartsin. On the territory of Haghartsin you will find a master class on baking gata, a traditional Armenian delicacy.

04:00 Alcotour. You will visit a small Armenian village nestled in the green and cool forests of Tavush. Upon arrival, you will be warmly welcomed into a village house where homemade fruit vodkas are crafted.

DAY 6

09:30 Departure

11:15 – Teatime in Sevan: discover herbal teas from Armenia. While enjoying your tea, you will be treated to healthy and flavorful herbal teas gathered from the mountains of Armenia. Additionally, you will have the opportunity to learn about the traditional methods of brewing Armenian tea.

12:45 – Cheese factory: Tour and tasting. In Sevan, you will also enjoy a tasting of cheeses produced in Armenia and a tour of a local factory.

01:30 – Tour in Lchashen and Royal meal. Lchashen is a site of archaeological interest, boasting many preserved archaeological layers and Cyclopean fortresses. The Cyclopean fortress of Lchashen is a historical monument of global significance, attracting visitors from around the world. Your welcome awaits at a guest house, offering an authentic Armenian experience, complete with the preparation of a royal meal.

03:45 – The largest surviving Noratus cemetery of khachkars. The Armenian khachkar is included in the UNESCO list of intangible heritage of mankind. Noratus is the only preserved khachkar cemetery.

05:00 – Sevan Peninsula and Sevanavank Monastery. There is no sea in Armenia, but there is Lake Sevan, which is the second-highest freshwater lake in the world after Lake Titicaca in South America. The charm of the peninsula of the blue-eyed Sevan is complemented by one of the architectural gems of medieval Armenia, Sevanavank. Here you will be treated to delicious seafood dishes from the freshwater lake.
